ONE-DAY FIRST AID COURSES

Lewis Park High School, 60 Jonathan St., Winnipeg, Manitoba

A basic first aid school course for final-year students will take place next Wednesday instead of regular lessons, starting at 9:00 am and ending at 5:00 pm. Two additional advanced first aid courses will take place at school over the weekend.

WEDNESDAY BASIC FIRST AID COURSE

GROUPS: Students will be divided into groups alphabetically. The groups will be similar in size to your language learning classes, where you are put into groups of twelve. As we would like to make the course training as effective as possible and give everyone a chance to try everything, the number of students in each group will be reduced.

TEACHERS: Students will learn basic first aid from qualified high school teachers. Although each class has been given a teacher, changes are still possible before the course starts – our school has the capacity to do that. However, we will not be able to make any unless we are informed about your preferences one week in advance.

ROOMS: For rooms, check the lists on the notice board on the ground floor for your group. Some groups of students will take the course in a regular classroom, some in the gym and some in a science room. The course will take place without any room changes.

COURSE: If you have your own first aid kit, you can bring it. Please tell Mr Plante, the Admin Secretary, so that he knows how many school first aid kits he has to bring to the course.

Your mobile phones must be off during regular lessons, unlike during the course, where you will use them to learn how to help save lives using the latest procedures and applications.

There will be three breaks during the course: a 10-minute and a 15-minute break as well as a 30-minute break to have lunch, which will be served in a nearby restaurant. It is a five-minute walk from the school, so please don't be late for the afternoon classes! You can use the other two breaks to get a coffee in the school canteen during the afternoon, as lunch will be served straight after finishing the morning training.

Please note that the school course is a part of our school's educational plan and it can hardly replace the official first aid course. If you want a Certificate of Completion¹, you have to take such a course.

ADDITIONAL WEEKEND ADVANCED FIRST AID COURSES

SATURDAY

This is a four-hour advanced first aid course focused on common causes of **child injuries**. Although the theory of first aid is a part of our basic first aid course, you will have it in this course as well. This is because helping a child requires a special set of skills. Another part of this course will be practical training. Registration will take place before the course begins at 8:00 am. Please come no later than 10 minutes before the course begins. The regular fee for this course is \$20.00. Unlike last year, when the students had to pay, this time the school has chosen not to request the fee.

SUNDAY

This is a four-hour advanced first aid course focused on helping people injured in **road traffic crashes**. In this practice-only course, you will use your theoretical knowledge from the basic first aid course to practise helping injured drivers, bikers, and cyclists. Registration starts at 8:00 am, half an hour before the course starts. This course is very popular, so don't wait too long, sign up now! The fee should be \$25.00 per student, but a local pharmaceutical company has decided to pay the costs of the course this year, student fees included.

Flo-Jo

Florence Griffith Joyner, also known as Flo-Jo, was an American athlete who set world records for the 100 m and 200 m sprints in 1988. Flo-Jo was born in 1959 in Los Angeles to Robert and Florence Griffith, who already had six children – her brothers and sisters – at that time. She grew up in the ghetto. When she was ten, her parents divorced, and her father left them on their own. She stayed with her mother, two sisters, and eight brothers. Florence was a very lively child and spent most of her free time with her eight brothers playing outside. As there were eleven children in the family, they all had to help their mother a lot.

When Flo-Jo was in elementary school, she joined a sports organisation, running track at weekends. Then she continued running at Jordan High School in Los Angeles, where she studied. However, she had to leave for some time to work, and she nearly didn't finish her secondary education. But her mother, who was worried that Flo Jo might end up having no education at all like her, wanted her to study further. While back at school, Flo-Jo went on running and qualified for the 100 m in the 1980 Olympics in Moscow. But she didn't actually compete there as the USA refused to take part in the Olympics for political reasons. She first took part in the Olympics four years later while attending California State University. At one point it seemed she wouldn't be able to finish university. But she didn't give up and graduated in the end despite being busy as a member of the U.S. National Team.

Apart from being a great athlete, Flo-Jo was also known for her personal style in running competitions. She designed many of her running outfits. She loved doing things in a way that was different from most people. For example, she persuaded the members of her team to wear tights at races, just like her. Wearing them was very unusual at that time. Another thing she used to do was put on socks that didn't match. Coaches weren't happy about it, so Flo-Jo only wore them off the racetrack. She didn't enter a competition even once without styling her long nails with stripes of red, white, blue and gold. What's surprising is that she never forgot to put jewellery on, and she kept her hair loose during races, although it could slow her down.

After the 1988 Olympics, Flo-Jo was very popular. Then in February 1989, she suddenly announced the end of her sports career. At first, some journalists thought she was going to say that she was pregnant and wanted to stay at home and be a mother. It is true that she had her only child later the following year, but this was hardly a reason for her to quit running. In her announcement, Flo-Jo said it was the lack of free moments for doing things just for fun. Flo-Jo's popularity was so enormous that many companies wanted to use her in their advertising, and she accepted their offers. It's surprising that she chose a different path instead of starting her own fashion brand that could have made her millions of dollars. Despite her success, not everybody liked Flo-Jo. Some people still believe Flo-Jo used drugs and that's why she was so fast. They think she retired from her career to avoid drug testing. But Flo-Jo always replied to such things: 'On the contrary, I've offered to be tested anytime.'

When Flo-Jo died in 1998 at the age of 38, it was shocking to most people. The news made me sad. Flo-Jo was the reason I started running when I was in third grade. I was lucky to get a great coach then. The coach reminded me of Flo-Jo, they looked like sisters. I wanted to look like Flo-Jo too, so I wore bright colours while running. People even asked me at some competitions if we were relatives. Oh, how I wished Flo-Jo had been my sprint coach or at least a friend! Later when I started competing with adults, I met Bob Kersee, Flo-Jo's brother-in-law and we became good friends. We always admired Flo-Jo and her performance!
